Emek Shaveh – archaeological tours in Jerusalem

Emek Shaveh's archaeological tour in the City of David, just outside the walls of the Old City of Jerusalem, and in the adjacent Palestinian village of Silwan, aims to expose the cultural wealth of the site and to describe the role of archaeology in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and in the life fabric of the village. At the site, archaeological layers – from Jerusalem's earliest existence and to this day – have come to light, and it constitutes a key focal point of political friction in East Jerusalem.

Breaking the Silence – West Bank tours

Breaking the Silence, a group of former IDF soldiers committed to exposing the reality of the occupation, guide two tours in the West Bank. The Hebron tour visits the settlement enclave in the heart of Hebron, the largest Palestinian city in the West Bank, and explores the harsh consequences of the policy of separation and the military presence in the city. The Susiya and Area C tour visits rural areas and Palestinian villages in the West Bank, exploring the injustices caused recurrent settler violence, restrictions on movement, access to land and water resources, and home demolitions.

Women of the Wall Shachrit service
