The Hotline is Israel's leading organisation protecting the rights of refugees, migrant workers and victims of human trafficking. For over 15 years Hotline staff and volunteers have been visiting Israel's immigration detention centers to monitor conditions, meeting with detainees and providing paralegal intervention and legal representation. Hotline represent some of the most vulnerable people in Israel and advocate for government policies consistent with a just, equal and democratic Israel. Their active Facebook page highlights the day to day issues faced by refugees and other migrant groups.

Worker's Hotline is a non-profit organization which aims to protect the rights of the most disadvantaged workers in Israel, addressing violations through individual assistance, advocacy, outreach and more. Their website highlights the economic struggles faced by different groups of workers including Palestinian citizens of Israel, agricultural workers, Israeli workers, West Bank Palestinians working in Israel, caregivers, refugees and asylum seekers and housecleaners, with helpful explanations of the issues affecting each group. Kav LaOved is unique in bringing their different struggles together.

B'Tselem: Conquer and Divide (Anna)

Israeli human rights group B'Tselem have produced an incredible interactive project explaining how, since 1967, Israel has taken over increasing amounts of land in the West Bank through annexation, settlements, military zones, checkpoints, national parks, the separation wall and more, resulting after 52 years in the fragmentation of Palestinian territory. Clear visualisations and concise explanations, with an easy-to-follow chronological approach, make this an indispensable guide for understanding the geopolitical reality in the West Bank.

Tag Meir are a group of Israelis who support victims of hate crime and educate against racism. Tag Meir was initially set up in response to Jewish hate crime: their name, meaning “light tag”, is a word-play on “tag mechir”, “price-tag”, the calling card of a small group of violent Jewish extremists. However, Tag Meir soon evolved into an organisation responding to all acts of hate, offering support and demonstrating an alternative way. Tag Meir see the fight against racism as an intrinsic part of upholding the traditional Jewish values of loving our neighbours and justice for all. It is not a political organisation, and their members come from across the political and religious spectrums of Israeli society. Their facebook posts provide regular updates and photos showing their inspiring work.
