“HOLDING LIAT”

We are proud to be a community and education partner for “Holding Liat”, a documentary film that captures both the pain of loss and the courage to keep reaching for peace. The film tells the story of Liat Beiniv Atzili, taken hostage by Hamas on 7 October, when her husband, Aviv Atzili, was killed. Since her release, Liat has become a powerful voice for compassion and coexistence.

LIMMUD FESTIVAL

At this year's Limmud, NIF invited two young peace activists to speak – one Israeli, one Palestinian. The room was full, but the mood was uneasy. A handful of younger participants were openly hostile, directing most of their anger at the Palestinian speaker.

Five days later, something had shifted.

Over shared meals, late-night conversations, and the quiet familiarity of seeing each other between sessions, the edges began to soften. By the end of the festival, those same students were seeking the Palestinian speaker out – walking together, talking, laughing, lingering long after events had ended. One of them said, with surprise: “This is complicated. I didn't expect you to be... the wonderful you.”



FINANCIAL STATEMENT 2025

In 2025 we raised over **£7.6 million** from **1,135 donors** who made **4,311 donations**. This included **£2.6 million** in general support for the New Israel Fund. This included some exceptional donations and **over £3 million** designated as grants to be disbursed over a three-year period.

Excluding the two exceptional donations, we raised **£3.83 million** in 2025, which was **£335k (10%)** more than 2024.

For consistent comparison, all figures are based on year-end management accounts. Our audited accounts for 2023 and 2024 are available online. Our audited accounts for 2025 will be available in the second half of 2026.
